Birthday Party FAQs

1. What is the cost for a birthday party?

\$10.50 plus GST for each participant, including children and adult supervisors.

2. What does this fee include? What does it not include?

Admissions, private rental space, and three games/activities are included. You will need to provide your own food and drinks as well as any dishes required. Please note that there is no refrigerator or microwave available on site.

3. How many activities/games can we do?

You may choose up to three activities/games.

4. Is there a minimum or maximum number of people?

There is no minimum. However, the maximum for a birthday party booking is 40 people.

5. How many adults supervisors are needed?

We require a minimum ratio of 1 adult for every 5 children.

6. If a parent wants to drop off their child, do I have to pay for them?

If the parent stays at the museum, then you will be charged for their admission. If they are quickly dropping off their child and leaving, there is no extra cost.

7. How long is the program?

You will have three hours exclusive use of the Education Area. However, you and your guests may stay afterwards and continue exploring the museum until we close.

8. Is there a deposit?

Yes, we require a \$50 deposit to finalize your booking. Cancellations made less than 48 hours prior to the event will forfeit their deposit. Otherwise it will be applied towards the total cost upon arrival.

9. What ages are the activities/games good for?

The guided tour, scavenger hunt, and flight simulators are not recommended for children under 5 years old. However, the games can be adapted for all ages.

10. Do we get exclusive use of the museum?

No, the museum will remain open to the public.

11. Who cleans up afterwards?

If you make a mess or move the tables/chairs, you are responsible for cleaning and ensuring the museum is left in the same condition as when you arrived.

12. Are there any restrictions on what we can bring?

Yes. As we are in a designated historic building, open flames are prohibited in the museum. This includes birthday candles and sternos for heating chafing dishes.
